Dr. Kimball is significantly involved in the medical community and has previously served as chair of the Workforce Task Force for the American Academy of Dermatology.

Alexa Boer Kimball, M.D., M.P.H., a board certified specialist in dermatology, is the director of the Clinical Unit for Research Trials in Skin, Harvard Medical School, vice chair of the Department of Dermatology at Massachusetts General Hospital and associate professor at Harvard Medical School. Prior to her current position, she was assistant professor and director of Clinical Trials in Dermatology at Stanford University in California. Kimball graduated Phi Beta Kappa from Princeton University and received her medical degree from Yale University School of Medicine, where she was inducted into Alpha Omega Alpha. Her postgraduate training includes serving as an Intern at Beth Israel Hospital, Harvard University, Chief Resident in Dermatology at Stanford University Medical Center, and Clinical Fellow in Dermatology at the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Maryland. She received her Master of Public Health degree from Johns Hopkins School of Public Health, where she was inducted into Delta Omega Alpha.

Kimball is currently conducting multiple dermatology trials, and her work has included studies of therapies for disorders such as psoriasis, atopic dermatitis, acne, and superficial basal cell carcinoma. She was medical producer and host of *On Call*, a weekly 60 minute public access cable television program for five years, and serves as an interview source for more than 40 media sources. Kimball has presented her work at national and international medical and scientific symposia and has contributed significantly to medical literature. Her articles and abstracts have been published in such journals as *Archives of Dermatology* and *Journal of the American Academy of Dermatology*, and her book chapters have appeared in several editions of *eMedicine Dermatology*.

Kimball is also involved significantly in the medical community and currently serves as chair of the Membership Committee for the American Academy of Dermatology and on the Board of Directors of the Society for Investigative Dermatology and the Acne and Roseacea Society. She previously chaired the American Academy of Dermatology's Young Physicians Committee and has served on the Society for Women's Health Research Medical Health Advisory Board and the Advisory Panel on the Purpose and Mission of Medical Schools of the American Association of Medical Colleges.
